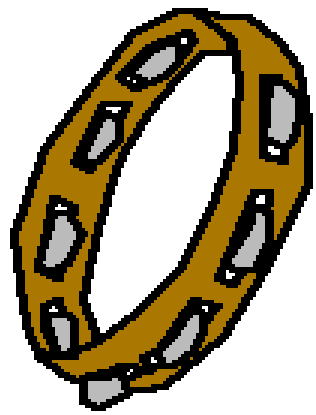

good to drink.



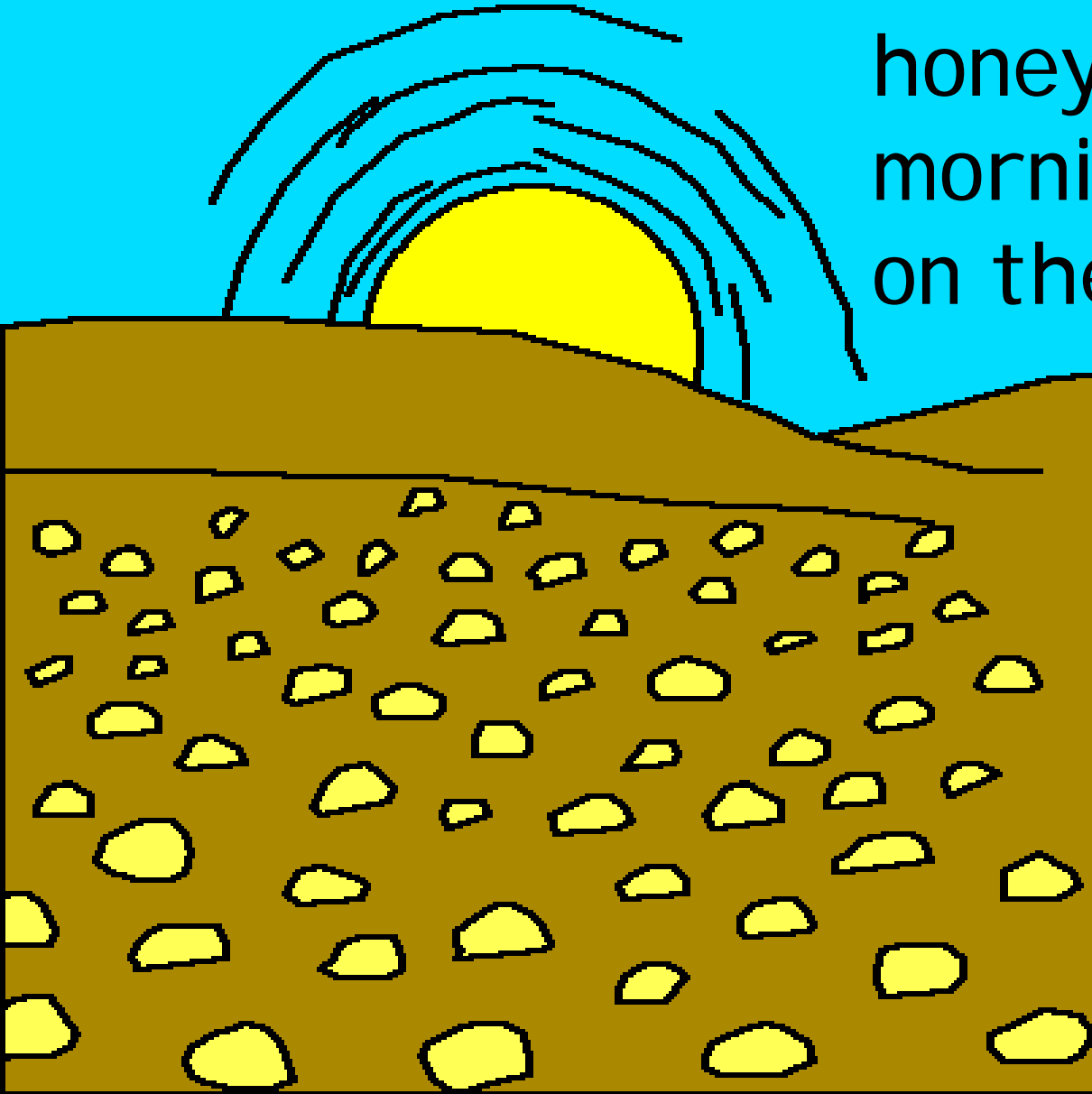


It seemed

quails. The people caught them easily.

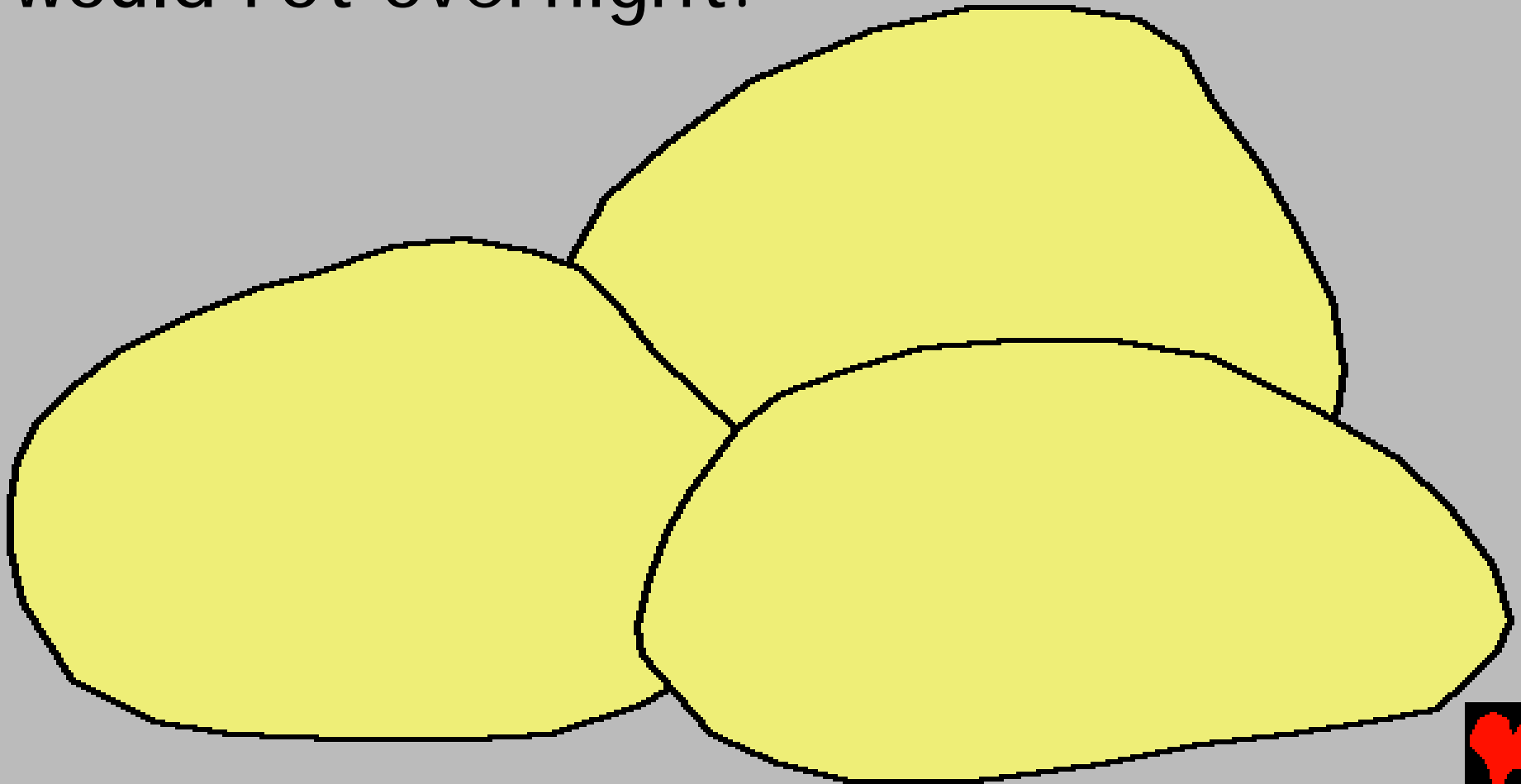


The next morning God sent manna. It was a kind of bread that tasted like honey wafers. Each morning manna lay on the ground ready

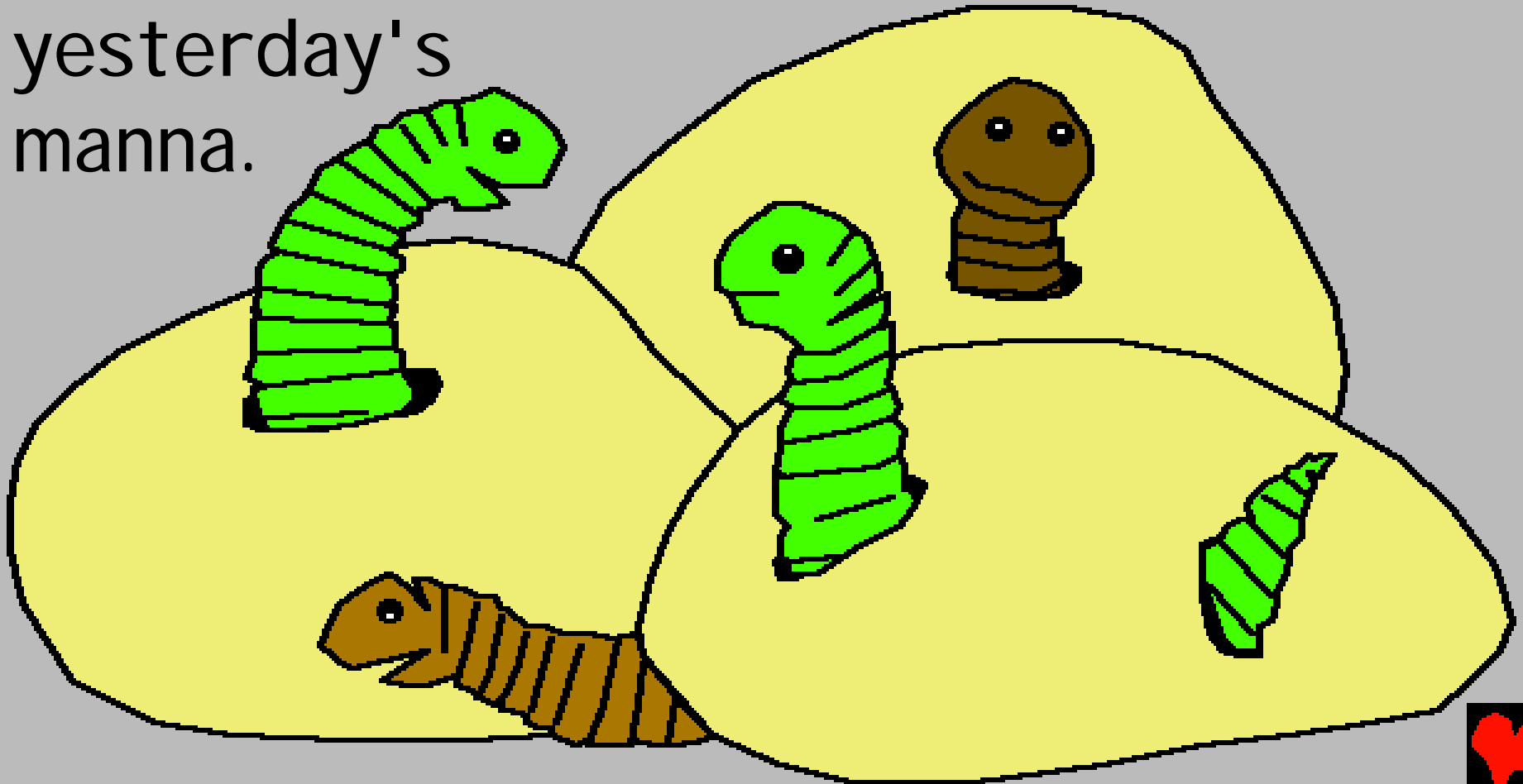
to be gathered. In this way God fed His people in the desert.



They were to trust God every day for new food. But some people gathered extra manna, even though God said it would rot overnight.

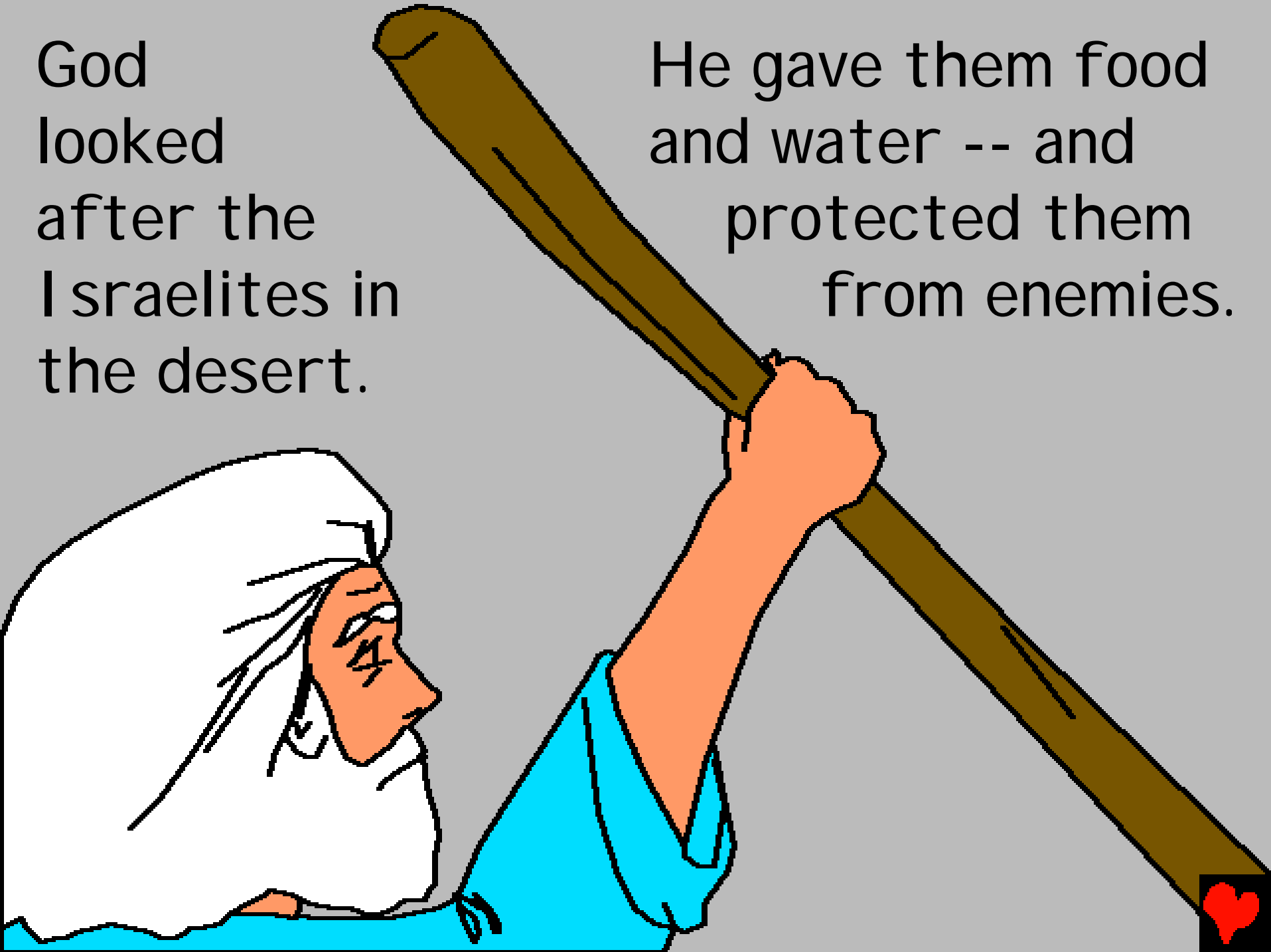


Sure enough, yesterday's manna was full of maggots -- except on Sabbath day. On that special seventh day the people rested and ate yesterday's manna.



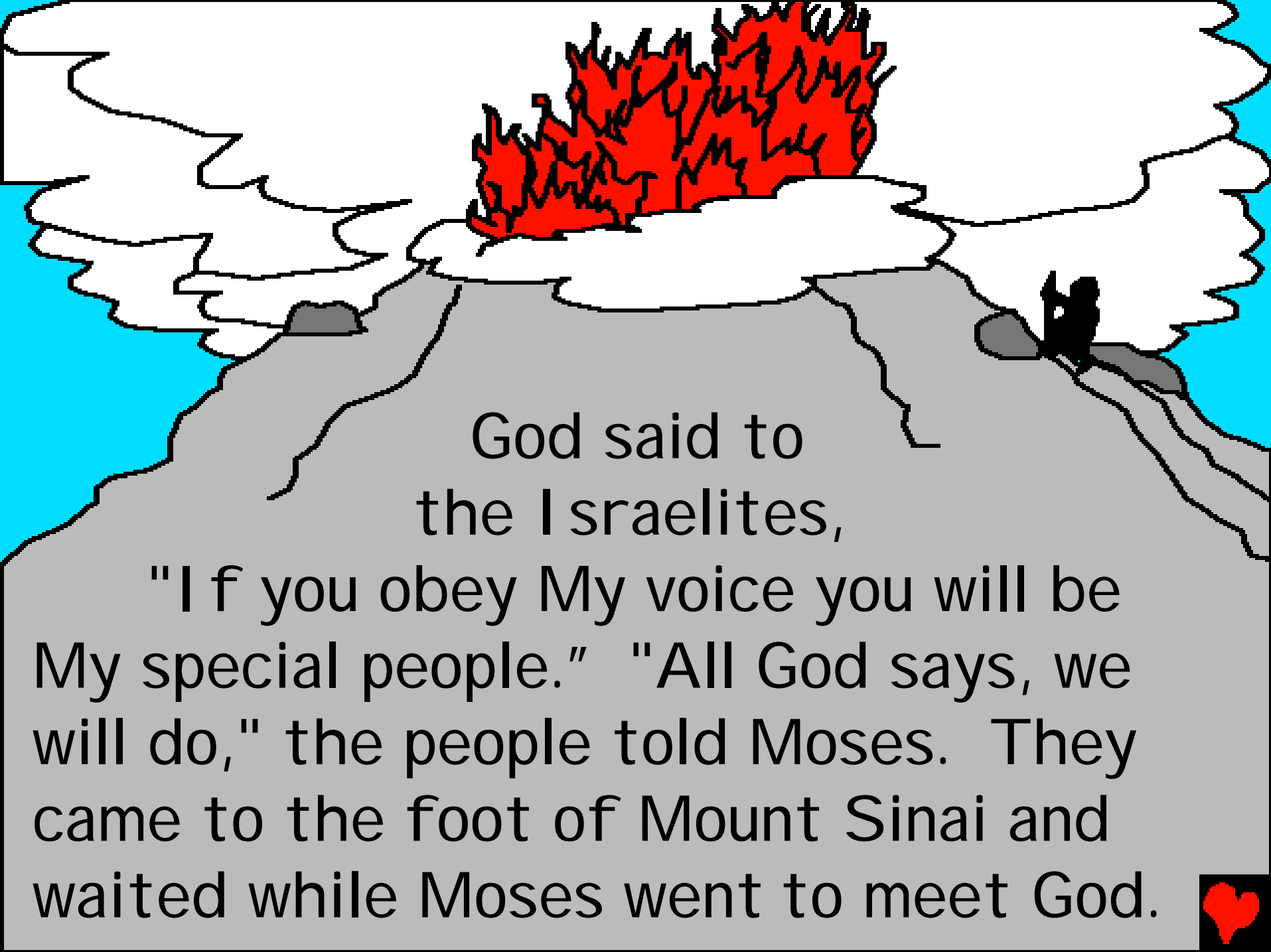
God

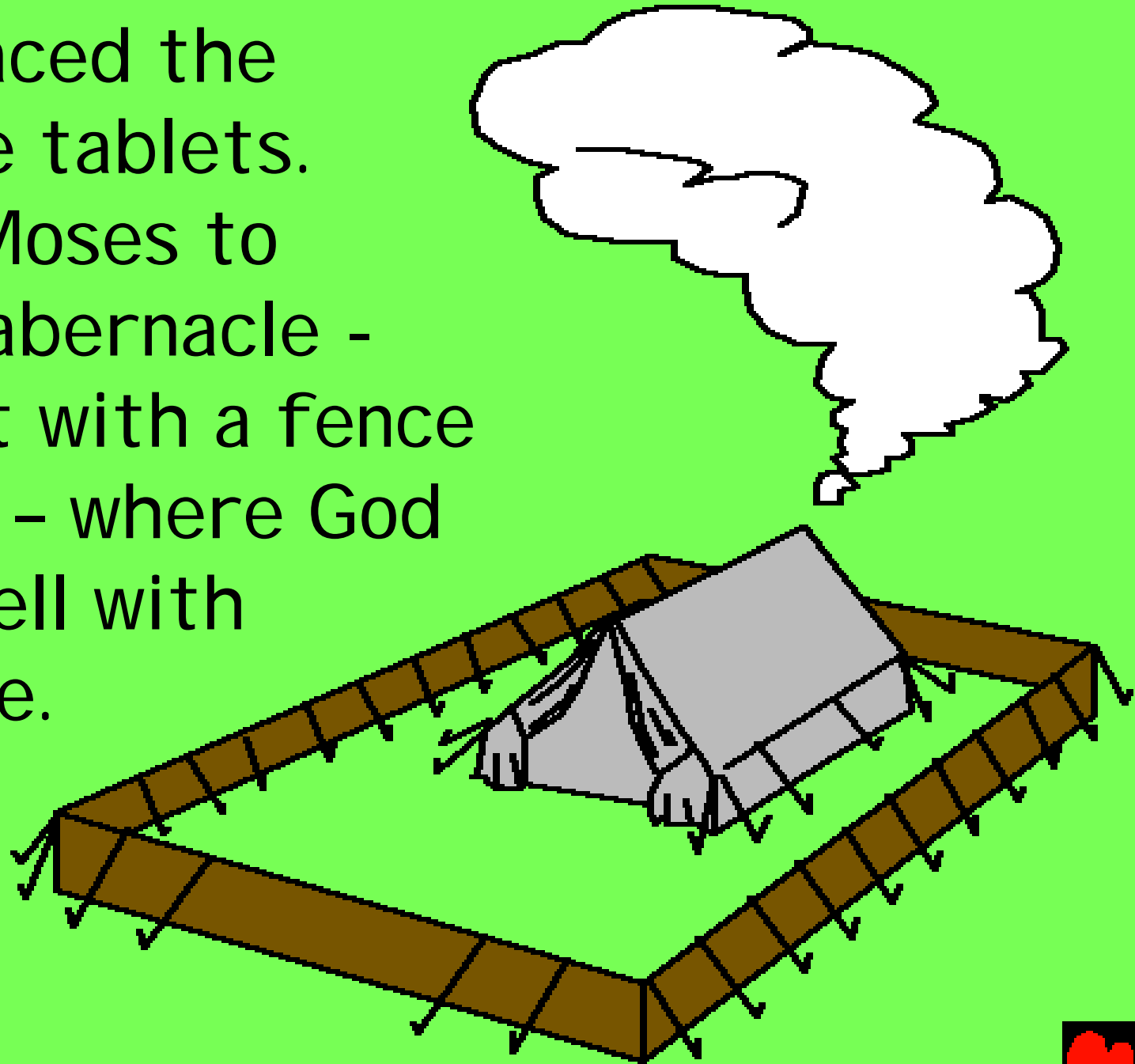




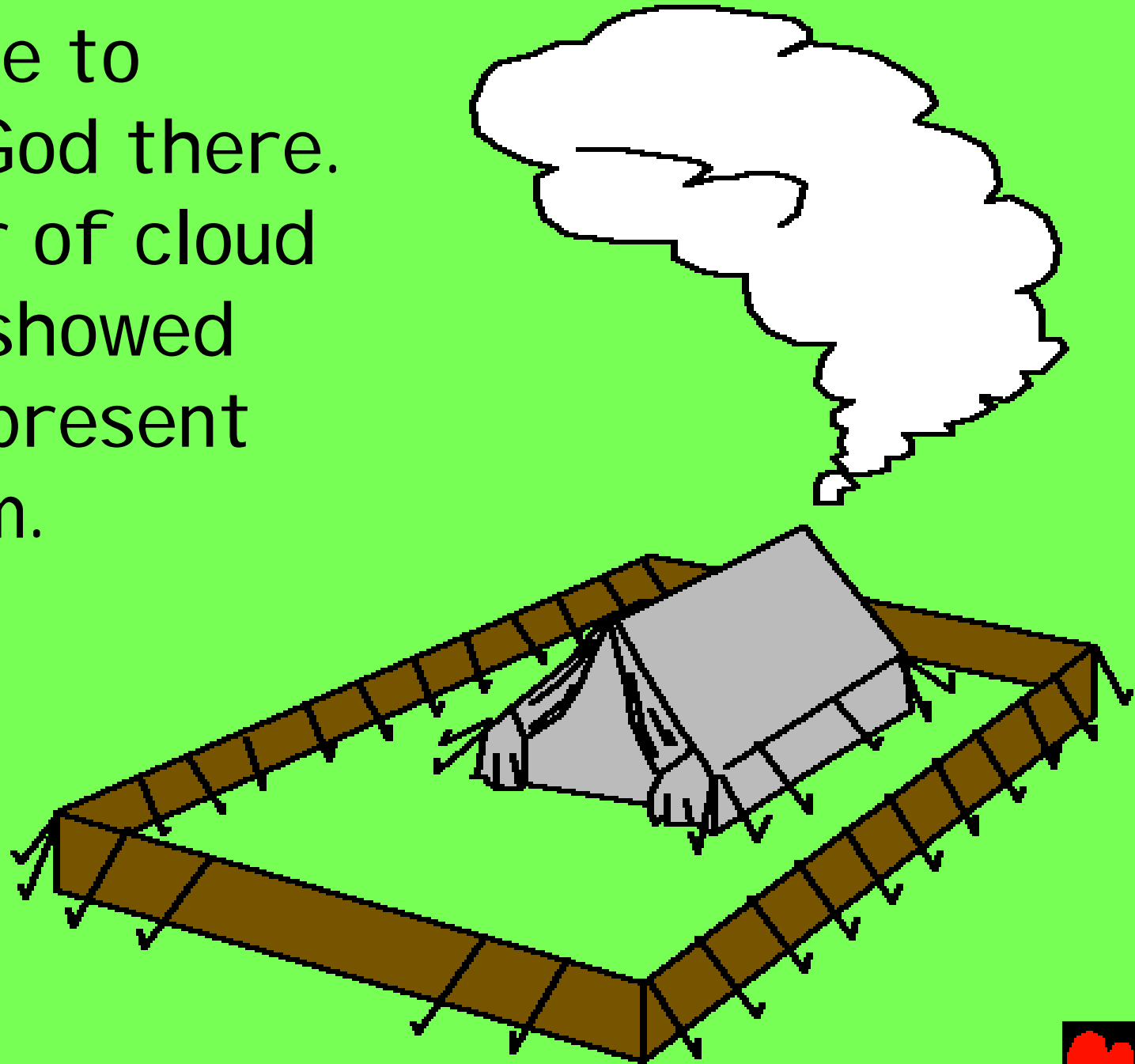
